Parking and Drop-Off/Pick-Up

This is a regular but absolutely necessary reminder to all parents to ensure that anyone coming to drop-off and collect does not arrive early and observes all of the following protocol. If you happen to approach Weston early then please pull in at the pub car park and wait.

The times to arrive are not a minute earlier than 8.30am in the morning, 2.55pm for Reception and KS1 and 3.10pm for KS2 (and KS1 children with KS2 siblings). Please don't arrive early and wait in a queue outside the gates. You will effectively be illegally parked on zig-zags and will obstruct traffic to Poppy Close.

Please trust the system and avoid pulling around cars as much as possible. In the morning, please allow staff to open doors and help children out of cars rather than getting out yourself. You are always welcome to park up at The White Lion and walk children to or from school but the turning circle system

should be quick and transient. Please help us to keep our systems efficient for the benefit of everyone by observing the strict timings and the above protocol.

Junior Sports Hall Athletics
