

The rest of Key Stage 2 joined us in the hall while the rest of the school watched a livestream in their classrooms. Children In Need

Year 5 Bikeability

Well done to the children in Year 5 who took part in Bikeability Level 2 this week. Over the course of two days, the children worked in small groups with the instructors. They built on Level 1 skills by



cycling on single lane roads, correctly approaching simple junctions and cycling on roads with moderate traffic flow – vital safety skills. It is important that the children continue to practise these skills and remember the safety messages from their expert training. Year 4 complete their Bikeability Level 1 training next week.
