A message from Mr Cutts

Today is Random Acts of Kindness Day. On Monday, Miss Griffiths led an assembly introducing the concept to the children. We talked about what kindness is and why it is so important to be kind in our words and actions. We also talked about the value of spontaneous kindness and how to incorporate acts of kindness into everyday life to make you and the people around you feel good.

Ask your child about whether they have been kind or someone has been kind to them this week. Ask them how they felt on all those occasions. Our culture of kindness and courtesy is commented on by every visitor to our school and recognising what this actually looks like is an important step for the children.

Random acts of kindness could include: leting somebody else go first; sharing your snack; drawing someone a picture; leaving a positive sticky note for someone; holding a door open for somebody; complimenting someone; donating toys or clothes to charity; washing the dishes without being asked.

Someone left me a lollipop with a kind message on my desk this week, which made me feel warm and appreciated. It's good to be kind.



Children's Mental Health Week

The children completed lots of activities designed to promote awareness of mental health and the importance of both self-help and positive relationships in terms of our mental health. The theme of Let's

Connect was reinforced in different ways. The children went on a walk around the school grounds and simply chatted to someone else. Some classes paired up to do this. We also spent time looking at the book Invisible String to reinforce the idea of how interconnected we all are, even when we aren't together. The children and staff also appreciated the bracelets they were given, which were made by the Year 6s. Finally, we explored how to articulate our feelings on Dress to Express day last Friday, where everyone wore clothes/colours that express themselves/their feelings.

Every school in The Cornovii Trust has had a review of its Special Educational Needs provision, led by Alison Ashley, a National Leader of Education with a wealth of SEND experience. She spent the day with us earlier this week and



She commented positively on the leadership and teaching of SEND and on the very high calibre of our teaching assistants and the work they do with some of our most vulnerable children. Her words echoed those of the Ofsted inspectors who visited last term and she felt that our school epitomised inclusivity. This is about more than just our systems and processes and individuals, it is about our culture and we are very proud of it. This review will enable the trust to identify ways in which we can exploit the many strengths across the schools to benefit all of the children we serve.
