Carol is a recently retired and experienced headteacher whose current work includes the role of school improvement partner.

New Outdoor PE Kit

As referred to in the September letter from earlier this week, here are more details of our new outdoor PE kit for children to wear on PE days when it isn't shorts and t-shirt weather. The tracksuit bottoms are priced at £10 (3/4 to 9/10) and £12 (11/12 to 13) and the hooded top is priced at £15 (3/4 to 11/12), £16 (13) and £18 (adult s/m/l).





The uniform policy is currently plain navy tracksuit (plain black is acceptable). This will be ammended ahead of 2022/23 to just plain navy or the new school tracksuit, however the new school tracksuit is available **this summer** from our uniform supplier – Smart Choice Uniforms in Alsager. In 2021/22, the children are not allowed to wear tracksuits that are not plain navy (plain black is acceptable). After a year of a more lenient approach to tracksuits due to the wearing of them all day being a new and not necessarily permanent thing, we will apply this policy fully and rigorously next year, with the children wearing PE kit for 2 days every week.



Street Naming Competition

The winners of the street naming competition that was run by Lane End New Beginnings were announced by a special recorded assembly this week. Ellie in Aqua Class and Luka in Blue Class were announced as the winners and their proposed street names, Autumn Avenue and Sidings Avenue, will be officially adopted as the names of two streets on the new housing development at Basford East, subject to council approval. We look forward to working closely with Lane End throughout the build.
