#### A message from Mr Cutts

I hope you all had a wonderful summer break and had the chance to relax and spend quality time with your loved ones. As we approach the new academic year, I want to extend a warm welcome to all our returning families and a special welcome to those joining us for the first time. We are excited to kick off another fantastic year at Weston Village Primary School, and I have some important updates and reminders to share with you.

#### School Spider and The Hive

Parents are connected to School Spider by signing into the app using the email address that we have on file. This is because School Spider is connected to our Management Information System (MIS) and automatically synchs every day. However, I have been advised that our MIS is having issues that can't be resolved until they apply an update at the start of next week. This only affects some parents of new starters. Parents of new starters with siblings already at the school should find that they are connected, but those without older siblings won't be until the issue is resolved.



Hive sessions will shortly be available to book for next week via the School Spider app. Parents of new starters without access to School Spider who require Hive before or after school sessions next week, should send an email to <u>thehive@weston.cheshire.sch.uk</u> Once the issue is resolved, all parents should be able to book Hive sessions beyond next week via the School Spider app. Although this is a matter out of our control, I apologise for any inconvenience it may have caused.

#### Change to the Start of the School Day

Starting from **3 September 2024**, the new timings for all children will be from **8.45am to 3.15pm**. School will continue to open its doors from **8.30am**, but all children are expected to be in their classrooms by **8.45am** to avoid a late mark. This aligns with the new DfE stipulation regarding the required number of school hours per week. For those parents who need an earlier drop-off, The Hive will continue to be available from **7.30am**.



### WHAT IS YOUR ATTENDANCE?



#### **Attendance**

The importance of regular attendance cannot be overstated. We aim for every child's attendance to be at least 97%. Good attendance is crucial for academic success and personal development. We will closely monitoring be attendance and punctuality, and will work with you to address any concerns. Remember, every day counts!

#### Term Time Holiday Fines

Please be aware that term-time holidays can significantly disrupt your child's education. As per the updated DfE guidelines, headteachers may not grant any leave of absence during term time unless there are exceptional circumstances. Fines may be issued for unauthorised absences, and we urge you to plan holidays during school breaks.

According to the new guidance, parents may be fined **£80** if paid within 21 days, increasing to **£160** if paid within 28 days. If a parent receives a second fine for the same child within any three-year period, this will be charged at the higher rate of £160. Fines per parent will be capped to two fines within any three-year period. Failure to pay the fine may result in prosecution, and you could be fined up to **£2,500** in court.

#### **Uniform Policy**

We expect all pupils to adhere to our school uniform policy. Key points to remember:

- Pupils are permitted to wear watches and small stud earrings, which must be removed for PE lessons.
- No unnatural hair colours or extreme hairstyles, including designs or lines shaved into hair.



- No nail polish.
- Ensure all uniform items are clearly named to help reunite lost property with its owner.

#### After-School Sports Clubs

As advised before the summer, there will be a change regarding our after-school sports clubs. Parents will now need to pay per half term as the school can no longer cover the cost. The clubs are reasonably priced to ensure accessibility for all children. The sessions are priced at £5 per week and this half term's can be booked here. Information following a cricket club (initially for Y4, 5 and 6) and staff-led extra-curricular clubs will follow.

#### Cashless School

Weston is now a cashless school. All payments will be made online

using **ParentPay** and **School Spider**. ParentPay will handle most school payments, including lunches, trips, and activities, while School Spider will be used for payments related to The Hive. This move provides convenience, enhanced security, and greater transparency in tracking payments.

#### <u>Class Dojo</u>

We will continue to use Class Dojo for communication between parents and teachers. It's a great platform to stay updated on your child's progress and school activities. Staff will post an update ahead of the new term including highlighting PE days.

Although staff regularly check messages and are quick to respond, if you message a member of staff, we will endeavour to reply within 2 working days. Please don't expect a response outside of school hours. If you have something urgent to



communicate, please telephone the school. Absences must still be reported to the school office by phone or School Spider.

#### School Meals Price Increase

The cost of school dinners has increased to **£2.60 per day**. We encourage you to check your eligibility for free school meals by visiting the Cheshire East website. This could provide significant support for your family.

#### No Dogs on School Grounds

For the safety and comfort of all our pupils, please remember that dogs are not allowed on school grounds. This standard policy helps ensure a safe environment for everyone.



#### Nut-Free School

For the safety of children with severe allergies, Weston is a nut-free school. Parents must be vigilant about packing lunches. Common offenders include Kinder Bueno and other chocolate/hazelnut-based items. We regularly check lunches and remove items deemed to be a risk.

#### **Medication**

Please ensure all medications are handed to the office with the appropriate documentation. It is your responsibility to ensure that inhalers and epipens are up-to-date.

#### Volunteering Opportunities

#### **Staffing Changes**

We are delighted to welcome Miss Roux, our new teaching assistant, who brings a wealth of experience and will be an excellent fit for our nurturing and skilled TA team. We also say goodbye to Mrs. Mitchell, who leaves Weston after more than 15 years. She will be missed, and we are actively recruiting a replacement.



#### Reception 2025 / Year 7 2025

The application window will soon open for both primary and secondary places for September 2025. I have already shown several prospective Reception 2025 parents around the school and look forward to sharing our school with others throughout the autumn term. Some admissions advice: if you have a child already at a school, you still need to complete an application within the window; don't just put one choice – carefully consider which schools you would be happy for



your child to go to in the event that they aren't offered their first choice. The deadlines are October 31 2024 for Year 7 applications and 15 January 2025 for Reception applications. There is no advantage in applying early but you must apply within this window. Please ask if you have any queries. If you don't live in Cheshire East, you will need to apply through your local authority, even if it's for a Cheshire East school.

#### Secrets of Success

We continue to underpin our school ethos with the Secrets of Success. Through this approach, we really single out the characteristics of successful people and actively promote and reward those qualities. The Secrets of Success are 8 qualities which we believe are essential to ensuring success at school and beyond. These are:



#### Mobile Phones

The children are not allowed to bring mobile phones to school. There may be occasional exceptions to this such as if a child has come to school from one parent's house and is going home to another parent's house. If this is absolutely necessary, please agree it with the class teacher in advance and they will keep the phone, which should be fully switched off, in a locked cupboard during the day.

#### Bringing Items into School

For health and safety and behaviour reasons, please note that there is a blanket ban on children bringing any items into school other than those necessary for their learning or additional support, or requested by their teacher, unless pre-agreed with their teacher via Class Dojo. This includes jewellery, as prohibited by our policy, with the exception of watches or small stud earrings. This applies to all children in all circumstances, including medals and trophies for sharing in Celebration assembly. To be clear, the children are encouraged to do this, but only once you have let their teacher know.

We will also reserve the right, as set out in our behaviour policy, to search children's bags if we suspect that they may have prohibited items.
