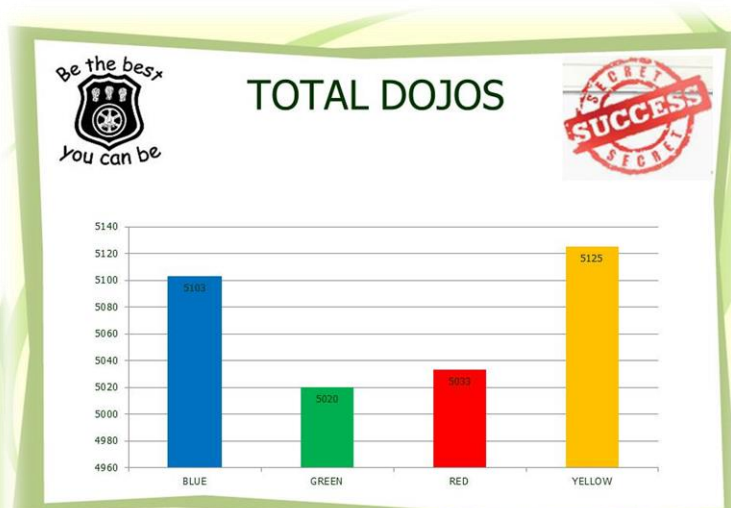
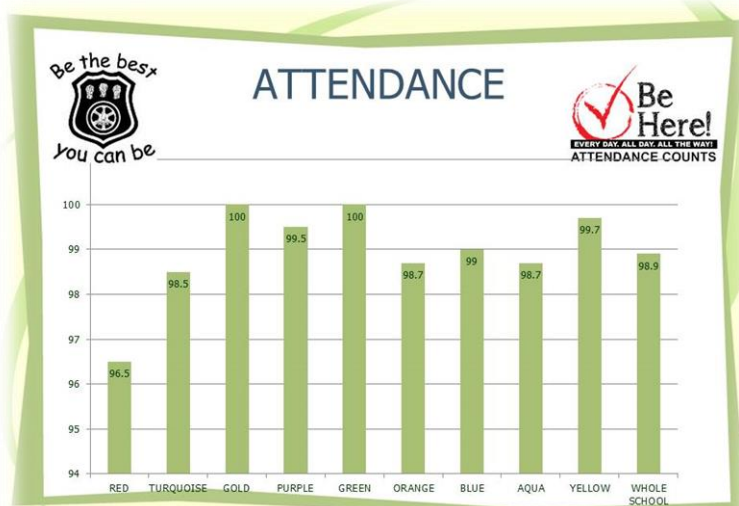


Celebration Assembly
