It is always a pleasure to show prospective parents around our school and it is something I get to do on an almost weekly basis. I get an imense sense of pride taking parents into each classroom to find staff and children engaged in quality learning. Our pupils are all so polite and welcoming and it's a delight to pass on praise to staff from parents who have enjoyed their visit. Several children have joined school this term, which is fantastic as we do have spaces in some year groups.

Speaking of new faces, we were delighted to welcome Mrs Nash on Wednesday this week for her first day as a Weston teacher. She spent the day with Mrs Loveland and Blue class, learning the ropes and had already spent some time with Mrs Jones. We wish Mrs Loveland and family all the best as they welcome their third child to the world but I am delighted to have secured the services of such a high quality temporary replacement in Mrs Nash. Together with Mrs Jones, Blue class remain in excellent hands.

Power Maths

As you know, maths is one of our current priorities and we have fully embraced the maths mastery curriculum. To build on what we have already achieved, we have invested in Power Maths, an enriched approach to teaching maths that combines interactive teaching tools, quality



textbooks and on-going professional development for teachers to ensure that we are always at the cutting edge of maths teaching. The approach is perfectly aligned with our current maths teaching and will elevate it as well as ensure absolute consistency in the teaching and learning of maths throughout the

school. Because we are part of the maths hub, we are eligible for match funding from the DfE for government endorsed maths resources such as Power Maths. Having trialled it in several classes over the last few weeks, it is clear that teachers and children enjoy this rich approach to maths mastery.

Staff Training

Professional development is very much valued at Weston and the staff continue to access lots of training. Mrs Bate, Mrs Lawton and Mrs Jones attended a Y5-Y8 maths transition training day at Alsager this week. They will continue to work closely with staff at the high school and other local primaries throughout the year to develop practice that ensures that



children have a smooth transition from primary to secondary maths learning. The high school teachers were very complimentary about our teaching approaches and about pupil exercise books and are very keen to learn from us.

Internet safety is embedded in our curriculum and our team of Y6 safety officers work hard to spread the message of e-safety. Next Tuesday is a national Safer Internet Day and children of all ages will complete activities which promote the importance of being safe online. 
Celebration Assembly


