STEM Week 2025: A Week of Curiosity, Creativity and Change

What a brilliant week we had celebrating STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering and Maths) across the school! With this year's theme of *Change and Adapt*, every class threw themselves into a packed timetable of hands-on activities, scientific exploration and thought-provoking learning.

Each day saw a different focus, from understanding physical and environmental changes to thinking like engineers and mathematicians. Classes explored everything from materials that change shape and state, to animals that adapt to survive and even how we ourselves can adapt and improve the world around us.

A real highlight of the week was Wednesday's whole-school Mad Science assembly, which brought explosions, experiments and plenty of excitement to the hall. The children were captivated and we're confident a few future scientists were inspired that morning!



On Thursday, our first-ever Weston Science Fair took centre stage and what a success it was! Children brought in home-made 3D science projects and models, showcasing everything from erupting volcanoes and solar systems to circuits, habitats and brilliant inventions. The care, creativity and effort that went into these projects was truly outstanding. Both staff and pupils loved exploring the display so much that we extended it for an extra day!

A huge thank you to families for supporting the children with their home projects and to Mrs Armitt for organising such a successful and inspiring week. Science Fair winners have been proudly displayed in the school entrance but we are incredibly proud of all the children's efforts.



A Generous Donation to Support Wellbeing Spaces

We are incredibly grateful to one of our school grandparents for a kind and generous £100 donation, which will be used to enhance our calm spaces - The Nest and The Den.



Well done to all involved. It was a brilliant event that gives our children the opportunity to grow in confidence




and share their voices!
