Enrichment Clubs

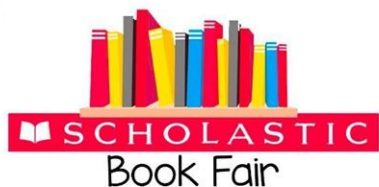
