Anti-bullying

The school council, led by the school and safety ambassadors will kick-off their year-long anti-bullying initiative next week. We do lots of work around bullying in school and help the children to recognise and respond appropriately to bullying. The school council team want to make this a prominent focus throughout the year to ensure that every child, regardless of their age, has lifelong strategies for coping with potential bullying behaviour and views school as the safe and happy place it is. Their first planned event is an assembly designed to raise awareness next Tuesday. The children have been

asked to wear odd socks to highlight the fact that we are all different and all equal.









Sickness and absence

If you need to take your child out of school, please complete a leave of absence request form and hand it in to the office. Absence will only be authorised in exceptional circumstances but it is courteous and saves a lot of admin time spent calling home when a child is absent, if we know where they are.

We would also really appreciate your honesty on your pupils absences; on several occassions when a child has come to school after an absence where we have been told that they are too ill to attend school, they have told a friend or the teacher directly about the holiday or day out they have had. It is really unfair to put a child in a position where they are expected to lie about where they have been. It is natural for a teacher to ask a returning child if they are feeling better after an illness absence so please consider the position you are putting them in if you choose not to be honest with us. We really value our home/school relationship and hope that it is based on mutual trust.

In terms of genuine sickness, if your child is off school with vomiting and diarrhoea, the government guidelines that we adhere to are that they stay off school for 48 hours after the symptoms have passed.

Climbing success

Oliver and Ellie from Aqua class braved the elements in their 5 and a half hour hike up Mt Snowdon in aid of a charity close to their family's hearts, the University Hospital Neaonatal Unit. Trips and visitors

Lots of the children have enjoyed trips and visitors so far this term, enhancing their learning through immersive and engaging experiences that go beyond their usual fun lessons. Recent trips have included Blue class's visit to Chester, which included a Roman march around the city and Yellow class's visit to the Imperial War Museum in Manchester to gain a deeper insight into WWII.
