Despite the ongoing challenges of Covid, we are very proud of the efforts we have gone to, to ensure that the children have been able to access so many enrichment and seasonal activities this term. We have enjoyed some magical performances from our youngest children in their nativity plays. They worked so hard on learning lines and perfecting their singing/shouting! Thank you to all parents for their support with costumes and adhering to the Covid measures. Thank you also to the staff who worked hard to provide the children with the opportunity to perform – such a important experience for them.

As I write, we are looking forward to a Key Stage 2 theatre trip, Reception and Key Stage 1 trip to the farm, Zoolab experience for Orange class, Friends of Weston festive trail for all the children (including a special guest) and our annual talent show – Weston's Got Talent. The children work hard on learning their core skills and the wider curriculum but it is vital, as we approach 2 years of limited opportunities, that the children enjoy as broad a range of experiences and opportunities as possible. Effectively planned and sequenced enrichment, culture, sport and other activities will ultimately have a positive effect on the children's emotional wellbeing, learning, Secrets of Success and life chances and, despite the necessary Covid measures, we must all strive to find that balance between these measures and our responsibility to the children's wider development. Thank you for signing up to



ParentPay. We currently have around 80% of children with one connected parent, so please do activate your account as soon

as possible. Once we have achieved as close to 100% as we can, we will prioritise connecting second parents

so that all are all as informed as you are used to. We will then phase out our use of ParentMail completely. The names might sound confusing because they both start with 'Parent' and sound like they hgave separate functions, but this is not the case. Like ParentMail, ParentPay is both a communication and payment platform.

It has been a pleasure to show so many prospective parents around our school this term. The window for applying for a place closes on 15 January 2022. If you don't apply for a place, you might not get one for your child at Weston. Please remember that you must apply for a place even if you already have a child at Weston. This is even more imperative this year because, as parents know, we have reduced our admissions number to 30, from September 2022.
