Cri du Chat syndrome. Cri du chat syndrome (CdCS or 5p-) is a rare genetic disorder in which a variable portion of the short arm of chromosome 5 is missing or deleted. On **5 May** we are asking the children to wear stripy socks with one pulled up and one pulled down. This is to represent the missing chromosome. This will reinforce the awareness work that we will complete with the children. As part of our approach to equality and diversity, we ensure that every member of our school community is 'seen', understood and made to feel welcome in the spirit of us all being different and

all being equal.
