A message from Mr Cutts

We are all incredibly proud of our Year 6 children for the effort and attitude they brought to their KS2 SATs tests this week. They seized them as an opportunity to show what they can do. While their KS2 journey has been particularly disrupted, Mrs Bate and Mrs Inskip have prepared them very well and the children took each test in their stride. It was lovely to see them all in early for their toast this week, bringing the right mix of being relaxed and focused. Their time at Weston will not be defined by these tests but they will reflect on how they approached them and should feel proud of their attitude.

The dates section is particularly large this week so that I could slot in all the recently planned activities without having to chop off any of the dates from the previous letter. There is still a lot going on for children in every class between now and the end of the school year and our packed calendar highlights how hard the staff team work to plan activities beyond the curriculum to enhance the children's experience at Weston. There are further sports events planned that will be added to the calendar in due course.

New teacher and next year

We were delighted to appoint Mrs Tyrrell to the vacant teacher role last week from a significant number of applications. Mrs Tyrrell will start officially in September, working 2 days a week. She is an experienced teacher with an ethos that aligns with ours and we are confident that she will complement the staff here at Weston.

Plans are well underway for next year and children and parents will be informed of which class they are going into soon. There will be some teacher movement next year. We have a policy of moving teachers around to ensure that they can develop their teaching craft and to maximise the expertise within the school.

Ahead of sending the letter, I will remind parents that we have an admissions number of 38 (although we have reduced this down to 30 for Reception from September 2022). Some of our year groups are a bit bigger than this and some are a little bit smaller. We are required to place the 7 year groups into our 9 classes which means that there are some mixed age classes. Class sizes next year will be around 25 in KS1 and 28 in KS2, with 30 going into Reception. Our 9 classes next year are Reception, Year 1, Year 1/2, Year 2, Year 3, Year

3/4, Year 4/5, Year 5/6, Year 6 and the children are sorted into those classes based on their dates of birth. We are expert at teaching to mixed age classes and always aim to challenge the children, whichever class they are in. The structure for next year means that some classes will inevitably split in ways that they haven't previously. At Weston we identify and promote the many positives of this necessary approach. More information on classes will follow soon. As well as our transition day on 30 June, our SEND children and others, where appropriate, will enjoy an enhanced transition to ensure that they are ready for next year.

<u>Jubilee</u>

You will have seen the letter from Mrs Loveland regarding our plans to celebrate the Queen's Platinum Jubilee. It promises to be a fun-packed day at the end of a week full of learning about Britain's recent history. The Weston community have also made plans for the weekend of the jubilee celebrations, on Sunday 5 June. All Weston school families are welcome to attend the event in the village (not the school event) on what promises to be a joyous day.
