Nut Free School

Here is your regular reminder that we are a nut free school. Some of our children have a severe nut allergy and the only way to manage the risk to their health is to insist that no one brings nuts or products containing nuts into school. This includes children, staff and any visitors. The obvious risks are with packed lunches and when children bring in sweet treats for classmates on their birthdays. If you require any further clarification, please ask.

Medical Needs

One of our pupils, Faye in Year 2 (Mrs McKenzie's class), is currently undergoing chemotherapy and, as such, has a compromised immune system. If Faye were to be exposed to measles, chickenpox or shingles, she would be at serious risk. If you suspect your child of having any of these illnesses, you should let us know immediately so that we can inform Faye's parents.

Faye's parents have asked me to convey their thanks for all the support and donations they received for their charity event to raise money for Alder Hey Children's Hospital in June. They raised a fantastic £2240!

Secrets of Success

We continue to underpin our school ethos with the Secrets of Success. Through this approach, we really single out the characteristics of successful people and actively promote and reward those qualities. Uniform

The children look very smart on their return to school. Please be reminded of our uniform policy, which is on our website. The key detail is here:

All polo shirts, jumpers, cardigans, PE t-shirts, PE hooded tops and PE jogging bottoms are available as branded items. However, it is not a requirement that pupils wear any of these items, provided their uniform conforms to the following and has no other branding or detail:

- pleated or plain black or grey skirt or smart black or grey trousers
- light blue polo shirt
- navy blue sweatshirt or cardigan
- plain black, white or grey socks or tights
- blue and white checked dress (summer)
- black shoes (not trainers)

PE and after-school sports clubs:

- navy blue shorts or navy jogging bottoms (not leggings)
- navy blue tracksuit top
- light blue t-shirt
- black or white trainers
- Pupils are permitted to wear watches. For safety reasons, the children are only permitted to wear small stud earrings, which must be removed for PE lessons and after school sports clubs.
- Pupils are not permitted unnatural hair colour (hair must be one colour) or extreme hairstyles, including designs or lines shaved into hair.
- Pupils are not permitted to wear make up or nail varnish
- Outdoor coats should be waterproof

Lost Property

Please ensure that all pupil property is named. We amass lots of lost property every term, much of which is never claimed, including jumpers and cardigans, bottles and even coats. Being responsible for your own property is a life skill and we ask that you reinforce this at home in order to keep lost property to a minimum.

Mobile Phones

The children are not allowed to bring mobile phones to school. There may be occasional exceptions to this such as if a child has come to school from one parent's house and is going home to another parent's house. If this is absolutely necessary, please agree it with the class teacher in advance and they will keep the phone, which should be fully switched off, in a locked cupboard during the day.

The School Day

Here is a reminder of timings. All children can be dropped off from 8.30am and no later than 8.55am, which is the start of the school day.

Children in Reception and Key Stage 1 can be collected from just before 3pm until 3.10pm. Children in Key Stage 2 should be collected from just before 3.15pm until 3.25pm. Families with siblings in both key stages should collect during the later slot. Please don't arrive earlier than these times or park on East Avenue, Cemetery Road or other nearby roads. If you arrive early, please park and wait at The White Lion. Thanks to our arrangement with The White Lion, you are also welcome to park there and walk down to school to collect.

Above all, please drive slowly and carefully near school.
