Mental Health and Emotional Wellbeing

Parents will know how well we support the children's mental wellbeing at Weston. There are lots of aspects to our work in this area that help us to quickly identify and intervene when children appear vulnerable to the risk of mental ill-health and our culture supports and promotes positive emotional wellbeing for all. To further enahnce our work in this area, we have employed Mrs Leopold, who will spend time at our school every week working with children and families in different ways. This will range from family support to ELSA work (Emotional Literacy Support). She has already started to work with some children and is very much part of our Weston family.

Buddies

We could not be any more proud of how well the Reception children have settled into life at primary school! They love coming to school and have quickly understood what it means to be a pupil at Weston – eager to learn, explore and have fun. The inspection team said it was hard to believe they had only been at school for 2 weeks! They each have a Year 6 buddy who spends time with them at playtimes and other times to support their happiness and success at school. The older children help them to develop strong friendships with each other and lead fun and safe playtime games. They spent some time today working on



collaboration, turn-taking and active fun! All of the children, young and old, love being a buddy – many of the Year 6s remember their buddy from when they were in Reception!

Drop-Off and Pick-Up

We have developed a system that should support smooth drop-off and pick-up procedures but they start to fail when parents arrive early or park on nearby roads.

- Please don't arrive by car before 8.30am. If you do, you will end up waiting on the zig-zags and you aren't allowed to do this.
- Our drop-off time is between 8.30am and 8.55am. If you arrive after 8.55am, your child will be marked as late.
- Arrive no earlier than 8.30am or park at The White Lion and walk down.
- At the end of the day, Reception and Key Stage One parents should arrive no earlier than 2.55pm.
- Key Stage Two parents (or those with children in both Key Stages) should arrive no earlier than 3.10pm.
- You must not park on Poppy Close, East Avenue, Cemetery Road or other neighbouring roads park at The White Lion, who very generously allow us to use their car park.
- Similarly, if you arrive early for any reason, park at The White Lion until the correct time and then drive onto the turning circle.

The reason why I am being blunt is because it is important that we do our best to respect the needs of our neighbours. There are some very elderly and vulnerable individuals on Poppy Close in particular who rely on ambulance access. If you obstruct the road or park on Poppy Close, you could be putting them at harm. Please work with us and our neighbours to ensure the safety and comfort of everyone – parents, children and residents. Thank you for your support.

Parent Governor

Although we had to shuffle our timetables to suit the inspectors and their lines of enquiry, we didn't cancel or change anything during the inspection, with the exception of the book fair, due to staff being required in meetings etc. We have moved it to Thursday 13 October. Details about location will follow.

Harvest Festival

The children will have a harvest assembly on Friday 7 October and our younger children will take part in some harvest workshops earlier in the week. Part of our harvest work on food involves us focussing on those in our community who, for different reasons, require the use of foodbanks. As ever, we really value your generosity and we ask that you, if you're able to, please send in dried food such as tins and packets (no fresh food). We are continuing our partnership with



local charity Chance Changing Lives and their Community Pantry and any food that you donate will be given to them and ultimately support those in need in our community. Please send this food in on the day, Friday 7 October. Thank you in anticipation of your support. Ask your child to sing you our harvest song – they love it!
